# Fall 2021 Update

- <u>Retriever Ready: COVID-19 Response</u> (covid19.umbc.edu)
- Planning for primarily in person campus for Fall 2021 while keeping health standards and COVID-19 best practices in place
- UMBC has committed to making a non-online class available for new international students entering the country in Fall 2021 should SEVP require it
- At this time no information on vaccination requirements for students

### Entering the US to attend UMBC for Fall 2021

#### Things to consider:

- You should already have a visa or plan to have a visa interview appointment by early August
- The earliest you can arrive in the US is 30 days before your I-20 program start date
- You must receive your visa and enter the US by the start of classes (August 31st)
- Be aware of travel restrictions in your home countries as well as in the <u>U.S.</u>
- Full time enrollment required (UG: 12 credits, Graduate: 9 credits)
- Last semester rule hybrid format rule might still apply SEVP will announce any changes/ updates as they occur (<u>US Entry Requirements</u>)

#### Transfer Students:

- Students currently in F-1 status in the U.S. transferring to UMBC from another institution
- Please follow regular I-20 transfer guidelines

#### Entering the U.S. after Deferring to Fall 2021

#### What happens to your I-20?

- IES will contact you once deferral is completed by Undergraduate/Graduate admissions
- Program dates will be adjusted to reflect your first semester in the U.S.
- We will request updated financial documents if over 6 months old
- We are currently processing Fall 2021 I-20s for newly admitted and deferred students
- Your SEVIS fee is valid for one year

#### Graduate Assistants (RA, TA etc):

- Please work closely with your department to explore your options if you plan to defer another semester
- If you are able to keep your assistantship, your department should provide you with an updated GA Offer Letter that reflects the semester you will be in the US

#### Entry to the US

- Only able to enter the U.S. 30 days before the start of your chosen semester
  - "Earliest Admission Date" section on your I-20
  - Fall 2021 semester August 1st

# On Campus Work Opportunities

- No immigration authorization required can begin working right away
- Apply through UMBCworks
- If you're new to the US you'll need a SSN after getting a job offer.
   IES will help you with that process
- How much can you work a week?
  - During semester: 20 hours
  - During summer/winter break: 40 hours
- Finding a position is competitive and not guaranteed



# Curricular Practical Training (CPT)

- Off campus work opportunity during your studies
- Must complete 2 full time semesters in the US to qualify
- Job must be related to major
- All majors are eligible
- How much can you work a week?
  - During Semester: Part Time 20 hours
  - During Summer/Winter Breaks: Full Time 20+ hours



#### **OPT and STEM OPT Extension**

- OPT = 1 year full time work permission after graduation
- Any job in any U.S. location related to degree
- Up to 3 months unemployment
- Work can be: part time, fulltime, paid or unpaid
- Job must be related to degree
- STEM OPT = 2 year extension of work authorization
- Who is eligible for STEM Extension? Any student with a <u>STEM eligible</u> major
- IES guides students through the process of applying for OPT and STEM OPT

### Requesting a UMBC I-20

Log in to the IES Portal with myUMBC credentials Select "New F-1 Student Request" Form

Upload all required documents

Receive electronic I-20 from UMBC

Pay SEVIS Fee Schedule visa interview

Allow at least 24 hours for change to register in your myUMBC account

#### **Required Documents:**

- Copy of your passport
- Proof of available funding for one academic year (\$35,982 for Graduate and \$40, 624 for Undergraduate)
- Affidavit or letter of support from financial sponsor



# Requesting Your I-20: Finances

- Amount required is based on **estimated cost** of an Academic Year (9 months)
- Amount is specific to UMBC only
- Required amount is subject to change
- As of Fall 2021 Admission at UMBC that is:
  - Undergraduate: \$40,624
  - Graduate: \$35,982
- No cost to request a UMBC I-20



# Requesting Your I-20: Sources of Funding

#### **Acceptable Sources of Funding:**

**Checking/Savings Account Bank Statements** 

**Approved Loan Documents** 

Scholarship Awards

**Graduate Assistantships** 

Fixed Deposits (only if you can withdraw the money at any time)

Documents CANNOT be older than 6 months

Letter of Support/Affidavit

#### **Unacceptable Sources of Funding:**

Stocks or bonds

**Real Estate Holdings** 

**Retirement Funds** 

Life Insurance Policies

**Unapproved Loan Documents** 

Documents older than 6 months

#### **Undergraduate:**

- Merit scholarships available based on GPA, test scores, application materials
- Contacted directly by Office of Financial Aid and Scholarships after admission

#### **Graduate:**

- Funding in the form of Graduate Assistantships (RA,TA)
- Not guaranteed and very competitive
- Funding is up to your specific department

### Frequently Asked Questions

- If I start classes online can I enter the U.S. in the middle of the Fall semester?
  - o No. Current F-1 rules prohibit this.
- Will my electronic I-20 be ok for entering the U.S.?
  - Yes, the electronic copy is valid for visa interviews and entering the U.S. You will also receive a letter of explanation from the ISSS Office
- I have a valid B2 Visa can I enter the U.S. that way and take online classes?
  - No. B2 visas do not allow visa holders to study.
- How do I defer my admission?
  - Undergraduates: email <u>admissions@umbc.edu</u> Deferral deadline: August 2021
  - o Graduate: Deferral Form No deferral deadline but the sooner the better!
- I already received an I-20 for a previous semester but deferred to Fall 2021. What happens next?
  - We will update your I-20 program dates. Once your deferral is approved, IES will reach out to directly about next steps
- Can UMBC guarantee visa approval?
  - We cannot guarantee your visa approval. We can however share resources throughout the semester on preparing for your interview.
- I have a valid F-1 visa from a previous semester. Do I still need to do a visa interview?
  - No. If your F-1 is still valid, you do not need to do another visa interview. You will need an updated I-20 that reflects a Fall 2021 program date for entry to the US
