


to apply for F-1 Visa

### Form I-20

- Issued by UMBC after admission
  - Program dates, level, study
  - Estimated cost of attendance
  - Permission to apply for F-1 visa
- Required at U.S. embassy and U.S. border
- Most important document for maintaining immigration status in future, not visa
- DO NOT LOSE

### Scheduling visa appointment

- 1. Pay I-901 SEVIS fee <u>www.fmjfee.com</u>
  - a. Must have Form I-20 to pay the fee
  - b. Current F-1 SEVIS fee \$350

- 2. Complete DS-160: Online Nonimmigrant Visa Application www. travel.state.gov
  - a. Must have Form I-20 to pay the fee
  - b. Current DS-160 fee \$160
- 3. Schedule a visa interview appointment at local U.S. Embassy or Consulate
  - a. Each U.S. embassy or consulate process differs slightly
  - b. Refer to website of specific embassy or consulate for detailed instructions at that post

### Scheduling visa appointment

ROM

- Many countries are experiencing delays or cancellations in visa appointments due to COVID conditions.
- The US State Department has stated the student visas as a priority, and as it is safe to start appointments again, student visas will be given priority
- Monitor Embassy websites for updates, like this one for India: <u>https://in.usembassy.gov/visas/</u>
- Embassy websites may have directions for Emergency appointments for students, or you can contact the Embassy to ask about emergency appointments if they are open

### The visa interview appointment

Required documents:

- Form I-20 (signed)
- I-901 SEVIS fee receipt
- DS-160 receipt and barcode page
- Valid passport



- Transcripts from previous study (secondary school, undergraduate degree)
- Test results (TOEFL/iELTS, GRE, SAT etc..
- Financial documents

### The visa interview appointment



- U.S. law assumes all applicants intend to immigrate
  - $\circ$   $\quad$  Burden of proof is on you to overcome that assumption
- Must establish strong ties to home country
  - 9 FAM 402.5(E)(1) "Possess residence in a foreign country he or she has no intention of abandoning"
  - $\circ$   $\ \ \,$  "Intends to depart upon completion of the approved activity"
  - Be prepared to explain why you chose UMBC, and your specific degree program.
  - Articulate your plans for after graduation related to returning home
- Consular officers are under pressure to act quickly
  - Conducted in less than three minutes
  - Usually conducted in English

### The visa interview appointment

Consular officer may ask:

R

- What do you intend to do after completing your degree?
- About your family's business in your home country or in the U.S.
- Why UMBC and why this particular program and degree?
- What are your long term career and academic goals?
- Where is UMBC?
- How will you support yourself while in the U.S.?
- How will you support your family in the U.S. or at home if they stay?

### Tips for a Successful Visa Interview Appointment

- Be prepared to establish ties to home country and nonimmigrant intent
  - Do you or your family own property?

RILLE

- Investments or inheritance in home country?
- Did you apply to the visa lottery in the past?
- Do you have close relatives who are U.S. citizens or permanent residence?
- Do your research
  - What is UMBC? Where is UMBC? Why UMBC?
  - What do you know about Maryland? Baltimore? Baltimore County?
  - Be prepared to explain your academic program/field of study in layman's terms
  - Why did you choose UMBC and not a different university?
  - What are your career plans and how does this program help you achieve them?

### Tips for a successful visa interview appointment

• Practice, Practice, Practice

R

- Most interviews conducted in English
- Speak for yourself
- Be brief and be positive
- Be honest
  - A lie (however imaterial) will likely result in denial
  - Social media question on DS-160
- Be concise and prepared
  - Organize supporting documents in advance
  - Remember, you have 2-3 minutes (if you are lucky)

### Visa interview outcomes

- 1. Approval
  - a. The vast majority of visa applications are approved
- 2. Failure to demonstrate nonimmigrant intent INA 214 (b)
  - a. Burden of proof is on applicant
  - b. Credibility and evidence does your plan make sense?
  - c. May apply again
- 3. Administrative Processing INA 221 (g)
  - a. Consular processing clerical or security (sensitive technology, terror, clearance)
  - b. "Washington-related"
- 4. Serious Ineligibilities INA 212 (a)
  - a. Health, previous overstay, security concerns, previous criminal charge, etc.

### Traveling to the U.S.

R

- A visa is not a guarantee of entry to the U.S., it is only permission to apply
- F-1 Visa holders can request entry to the U.S. up to 30 days before I-20 start date
- U.S. Customs and Border Protection (CBP) has broad authority at U.S. Ports of Entry
  - All arriving "applicants for admission" are inspected by CBP to determine admissibility



### Inspection at Port of Entry



Primary inspection

Required documents:

- Passport with at least six months future validity
- Form I-20

Suggested documents:

- Admission letter/academic transcripts
- Evidence of financial support

### Inspection at Port of Entry



Secondary inspection

- Not a cause for alarm
- Applicants to taken to secondary:
  - SEVIS technical issues
  - Efficiency
  - Extra screening
  - Review documents
  - Officer training issue


### Admission to the U.S.

Assigns I-94 number and admission status:

- F-1
- D/S
- May or may not stamp your passport

I-515A

- Temporary admission
- Must contact a DSO (IES staff) to comply



### Port of Entry Tips

- Remain calm
- Keep your documents in your carry on luggage
- Ensure your passport has six months of future validity
  - Present F-1 visa foil, not B-1/B-2
- Do not lie to a CBP officer
- Know how to contact UMBC
  - After hours: 410-455-5555 ask to speak to "ISSS"
- Check your I-94 record



### What to Pack

- Clothing: Baltimore has 4 distinct seasons
  - It will still be summer when you arrive. Prepare for the warm weather!
  - Pack some pants and layers as we enter the cooler seasons.
  - Winter clothing can be purchased at reasonable prices in the US. Once winter arrives
- Personal items: books, music, something that reminds you of home
- Food: no live agricultural products! Dried spices are usually acceptable.
  - <u>CBP General Food List</u>
  - A lot of stores in the Baltimore/D.C. area carry foods from your home country
- Documents: in your carry-on luggage, NOT checked luggage!
- Cell phone: will you need a SIM card? Phone plan?

### Arrival Weather

#### It will be summer!

- Make sure you have clothes with you that will help you feel comfortable in temperatures around **averaging 28.5 degrees celsius**
- In August in Maryland, most people would wear cool, loose clothing.
  Shorts, t-shirts, and light clothing to stay cool.
- Occasionally, Maryland also experiences summer storms. Make sure you have an umbrella/prepare to move indoors if storms are predicted

#### Maryland has 4 distinct seasons!

### COVID best practices and quarantine

- Wear a mask that covers your nose and mouth at all times.
- Comply with **all** health and safety protocols of the airline and airport

Quarantine requirements:

- **Fully vaccinated** (with a WHO approved vaccine) individuals do not need to quarantine
- At this time, unvaccinated or partially vaccinated individuals (this includes those who are vaccinated with a non-FDA or WHO approved vaccine) will need to quarantine for 7 days when they arrive, and be tested for COVID-19 3-5 days after travel.

### How to Check In with ISSS

- All new international students must confirm arrival with ISSS
- Complete "New Student Arrival Documentation Check-in" in the ISSS Portal
  - Select your Term: "Fall, 2021"
  - Upload documents: Visa stamp page, I-94 record
  - **Update your personal information on myUMBC:** U.S. address, Foreign address, U.S. phone number, Foreign phone number, Emergency contact




• Can begin working right away



### MyUMBC - Updating your information

- Update the following:
  - Student Mailing Address, to your US address
  - Phone Numbers, once you set up a US number
  - Emergency Contacts this is who UMBC will communicate with should you have a serious emergency
- Use the "edit" link to make changes to each field.

#### It is EXTREMELY IMPORTANT to update this information, which we need to make your immigration record active once you arrive, and is required by immigration law!



### Getting Around - Transportation Off Campus

\*Keep COVID-19 restrictions and protocols in mind when utilizing public transportation\*

- Public Transportation: Maryland Transportation Authority
  - Bus: takes you throughout Baltimore, and surrounding cities
  - Metro: takes you throughout Baltimore
  - Light Rail: takes you throughout Baltimore
  - Fare: \$1.90 per trip, All Access College Transit Pass: \$52.90 per month
- Free Options:
  - <u>Charm City Circulator</u> (downtown Baltimore only)
  - UMBC shuttle
- Getting your License:
  - SEVIS record MUST be registered
  - <u>Complete S.A.V.E Verification</u>
  - Visit MVA's website
  - On campus parking permits are free. Please apply here: <u>Parking Permits</u>
- Traveling further outside of Baltimore and Maryland, check out the arrival guide for long distance options

### Banking
