#### **Form I-20**

- Issued by UMBC after admission
  - Program dates, level, study
  - Estimated cost of attendance
  - Permission to apply for F-1 visa
  - Electronic print and sign in blue ink
- Required at U.S. embassy and U.S. border
- Most important document for maintaining immigration status in future, not visa
- DO NOT LOSE

# Scheduling Visa Appointment

- 1. Pay I-901 SEVIS fee www.fmjfee.com
  - Form I-20 required
  - Current F-1 SEVIS fee \$350
- 2. Complete DS-160: Online Nonimmigrant Visa Application www. travel.state.gov
  - Form I-20 required
  - Current DS-160 fee \$160
- 3. Schedule a visa interview appointment at local U.S. Embassy or Consulate
  - Each U.S. embassy or consulate process differs slightly
  - Refer to website of specific embassy or consulate for detailed instructions at that post





# Scheduling Visa Appointment

- Many countries are experiencing delays or cancellations in visa appointments due to COVID conditions.
- The US State Department has stated the student visas as a priority, and as it is safe to start appointments again, student visas will be given priority
- Monitor Embassy websites for updates, like this one for India: <a href="https://in.usembassy.gov/visas/">https://in.usembassy.gov/visas/</a>
- Embassy websites may have directions for Emergency appointments for students, or you can contact the Embassy to ask about emergency appointments if they are open





# The Visa Interview Appointment

#### Required documents:

- Form I-20
- I-901 SEVIS fee receipt
- DS-160 receipt and barcode page
- Valid passport
- Transcripts from previous study (secondary school, undergraduate degree)
- Test results (TOEFL/iELTS, GRE, SAT etc..
- Financial documents





# The Visa Interview Appointment

- U.S. law assumes all applicants intend to immigrate
  - Burden of proof is on you to overcome that assumption
- Must establish strong ties to home country
  - 9 FAM 402.5(E)(1) "Possess residence in a foreign country he or she has no intention of abandoning"
  - "Intends to depart upon completion of the approved activity"
  - Be prepared to explain why you chose UMBC, and your specific degree program.
  - Articulate your plans for after graduation related to returning home
- Consular officers are under pressure to act quickly
  - Conducted in less than three minutes
  - Usually conducted in English

# The Visa Interview Appointment

#### Consular officer may ask:

- What do you intend to do after completing your degree?
- About your family's business in your home country or in the U.S.
- Why UMBC and why this particular program and degree?
- What are your long term career and academic goals?
- Where is UMBC?
- How will you support yourself while in the U.S.?
- How will you support your family in the U.S. or at home if they stay?

### Tips for a Successful Visa Interview Appointment

- Be prepared to establish ties to home country and nonimmigrant intent
  - Do you or your family own property?
  - Investments or inheritance in home country?
  - Did you apply to the visa lottery in the past?
  - Do you have close relatives who are U.S. citizens or permanent residence?
- Do your research
  - What is UMBC? Where is UMBC? Why UMBC?
  - What do you know about Maryland? Baltimore? Baltimore County?
  - Be prepared to explain your academic program/field of study in layman's terms
  - Why did you choose UMBC and not a different university?
  - What are your career plans and how does this program help you achieve them?





### Tips for a Successful Visa Interview Appointment

#### • Practice, Practice, Practice

- Most interviews conducted in English
- Speak for yourself
- Be brief and be positive

#### Be honest

- A lie (however immaterial) will likely result in denial
- Social media question on DS-160

#### Be concise and prepared

- Organize supporting documents in advance
- Remember, you have 2-3 minutes (if you are lucky)



#### Visa Interview Outcomes

#### 1. Approval

The vast majority of visa applications are approved

#### 2. Failure to demonstrate nonimmigrant intent - INA 214 (b)

- Burden of proof is on applicant
- Credibility and evidence does your plan make sense?
- May apply again

#### 3. Administrative Processing - INA 221 (g)

- Consular processing clerical or security (sensitive technology, terror, clearance)
- "Washington-related"

#### 4. Serious Ineligibilities - INA 212 (a)

 Health, previous overstay, security concerns, previous criminal charge, etc.







# Traveling to the U.S.

- A visa is not a guarantee of entry to the U.S., it is only permission to apply
- F-1 Visa holders can request entry to the U.S. up to 30 days before I-20 start date
  - January 31st Start Date = January 1st Earliest Entry
  - January 2nd Start Date (GAs only) = December 3rd Earliest Entry
- U.S. Customs and Border Protection (CBP) has broad authority at U.S. Ports of Entry
  - All arriving "applicants for admission" are inspected by CBP to determine admissibility





# Inspection at Port of Entry

#### **Primary Inspection**

#### Required documents:

- Passport with at least six months future validity
- Form I-20

#### Suggested documents:

- Admission letter/academic transcripts
- Evidence of financial support





# Inspection at Port of Entry

#### **Secondary Inspection**

- Not a cause for alarm
- Applicants to taken to secondary:
  - SEVIS technical issues
  - Efficiency
  - Extra screening
  - Review documents
  - Officer training issue





# **Port of Entry Tips**


- Review International Student Arrival Guide
- Remain calm
- Keep your documents in your carry on luggage
- Ensure your passport has six months of future validity
  - Present F-1 visa foil, not B-1/B-2
- Do not lie to a CBP officer
- Know how to contact UMBC in case of emergency
  - After hours: 410-455-5555 ask to speak to "ISSS"
- Check your I-94 record

# COVID -19 Vaccination Requirements

- Proof of vaccination BEFORE traveling to the U.S. is now required
- Present vaccination information to airline and/or U.S. Customs and Border Protection, NOT ISSS or during visa interview
- Effectively vaccinated = **two weeks after** single dose series, 2 dose series, or accepted mix and match series 17 days apart
- Exemptions for countries with "limited availability"





# Approved Vaccines

• Effectively vaccinated = two weeks after single dose series, 2 - dose series, or accepted mix and match series 17 days apart

## Limited Availability Exemption

- Must provide proof plan to get vaccinated within 60 days of arrival.
- UMBC will provide this.

## Fall 2022 Considerations



## Things To Consider For Fall 2022

- Visa or visa interview appointment by early August
- The earliest you can arrive in the US is 30 days before your I-20 program start date
- Must enter US by August 31st
- Be informed of travel and vaccine requirements in your home countries as well as in the <u>U.S.</u>
- Full time enrollment required (UG: 12 credits, Graduate: 9 credits)
- Must take at least one hybrid or in person class
- UMBC is offering a combination of in person, hybrid and online courses

#### **Transfer Students:**

- Students currently in F-1 status in the U.S. transferring to UMBC from another institution
- Please follow regular I-20 transfer guidelines
- Planning to travel home? Already at home and planning to return for Fall 2022?

## Entering the US after Deferring To Fall 2022

#### What happens to your I-20?

- Program dates must be adjusted
- Updated financial documents required if originals are over 6 months old
- SEVIS fee is valid for one year

#### **Graduate Assistants (RA, TA etc)**

Work directly with department on updating your GA offer

#### **Entry to the US**

- Fall 2022 semester begins August 31st
- Only able to enter the U.S. 30 days before the start of Fall 2022
- "Earliest Admission Date" section on your I-20
- Fall 2022 semester August 1st
