




About ISSS






Rest assured, once you submit your request in the portal, it has been received! Make sure it's submitted!

1. Issues I-20 required to apply for F-1 Visa


2. Issues F-1 Visa

The Visa Interview Appointment

Consular officer may ask:

- What do you intend to do after completing your degree?
- About your family's business in your home country or in the U.S.
- Why UMBC and why this particular program and degree?
- What are your long term career and academic goals?
- Where is UMBC?
- How will you support yourself while in the U.S.?
- How will you support your family in the U.S. or at home if they stay?





Tips for a Successful Visa Interview Appointment

- Be prepared to establish ties to home country and nonimmigrant intent
 - Do you or your family own property?
 - Investments or inheritance in home country?
 - Did you apply to the visa lottery in the past?
 - Do you have close relatives who are U.S. citizens or permanent residence?
- Do your research
 - What is UMBC? Where is UMBC? Why UMBC?
 - What do you know about Maryland? Baltimore? Baltimore County?
 - Be prepared to explain your academic program/field of study in layman's terms
 - Why did you choose UMBC and not a different university?
 - What are your career plans and how does this program help you achieve them?





Tips for a Successful Visa Interview Appointment

Practice, Practice, Practice

- Most interviews conducted in English
- Speak for yourself
- Be brief and be positive

Be honest

A lie (however immaterial) will likely result in denial

Be concise and prepared

- Organize supporting documents in advance
- Remember, you have 2-3 minutes (if you are lucky)






What if I Can't Get a Visa in Time?


- Must receive visa and enter U.S. by first day of classes
- Options if you cannot make this deadline:
 - Defer your admission to a future semester. Directions to defer your admission are here:
 - Graduate Students: https://gradschool.umbc.edu/students/forms/
 - Undergraduate Students: email admissions@umbc.edu
 - Begin your program enrollment remotely from outside of the US, if your department has online classes available, and can come to the US at the beginning of a future semester.
 - Check with your department directly about availability
 - Must be physically in US for two academic semesters for CPT/OPT
- Can I enter the U.S. with a visitor visa and study? No. B1/B2 visas do not allow the holder to study full time







Spring 2023 Considerations



Things To Consider For Spring 2023

- Visa or visa interview appointment by early January
- The earliest you can arrive in the US is 30 days before your I-20 program start date
- Must enter US by January 30th
- Be informed of travel and vaccine requirements in your home countries as well as in the <u>U.S.</u>
- Full time enrollment required (UG: 12 credits, Graduate: 9 credits)
- Must take at least **one** hybrid or in person class
- UMBC is offering a combination of in person, hybrid and online courses

Transfer Students:

- Students currently in F-1 status in the U.S. transferring to UMBC from another institution
- Please follow regular I-20 transfer guidelines
- Planning to travel home? Already at home and planning to return for Spring 2023?

Entering the US after Deferring To Spring 2023

What happens to your I-20?

- Program dates must be adjusted OR new completely new Form I-20 issued
- Updated financial documents required if originals are over 6 months old
- SEVIS fee is valid for one year

Graduate Assistants (RA, TA etc)

Work directly with department on updating your GA offer

Entry to the US

- Spring 2023 semester begins January 30th
- Only able to enter the U.S. at most 30 days before the start of Spring 2023
- "Earliest Admission Date" section on your I-20



Deferring Your Admission To a Future Semester

Undergraduate Students:

• Contact UMBC Undergraduate Admissions - admissions@umbc.edu

Graduate Students:

- Submit a <u>Deferral of Admission Form</u>
- Contact Graduate Admissions with additional questions: gradschool@umbc.edu
- Your I-20 must be adjusted to reflect your new start date





Traveling to the U.S.

- A visa is not a guarantee of entry to the U.S., it is only permission to apply
- F-1 Visa holders can request entry to the U.S. up to 30 days before I-20 start date
 - January 30th start date = December 31st earliest entry
 - Check your I-20 for your "Earliest Admission Date"
- U.S. Customs and Border Protection (CBP) has broad authority at U.S. Ports of Entry
 - All arriving "applicants for admission" are inspected by CBP to determine admissibility





Traveling to the U.S.

Did you receive your visa with another school's I-20 but plan to attend UMBC?:

 Apply for a SEVIS Fee Transfer. Instructions on completing this are available here: <u>SEVIS Fee Transfer Request</u> under the title "How do I ask SEVP to transfer the I-901 SEVIS fee payment information from one SEVIS ID number to another?"



- Enter the US with your UMBC I-20
- This should be done **before** entering the U.S.



Inspection at Port of Entry

Primary Inspection

Required documents:

- Passport with at least six months future validity
- Form I-20

Suggested documents:

- Admission letter/academic transcripts
- Evidence of financial support





Inspection at Port of Entry

Secondary Inspection

- Not a cause for alarm
- Applicants to taken to secondary:
 - SEVIS technical issues
 - Efficiency
 - Extra screening
 - Review documents
 - Officer training issue
- Call UMBC Police at +1 410-455-5555 and ask to speak with an international student advisor





Admission to U.S.

Assigns I-94 number and admission status:

- F-1
- D/S
- May or may not stamp your passport

I-515A

- Temporary admission
- Must contact a DSO (ISSS team) to comply

Port of Entry Tips

- Review International Student Arrival Guide
- Remain calm
- Keep your documents in your carry on luggage
- Ensure your passport has six months of future validity
 - Present F-1 visa foil, not B-1/B-2
- Do not lie to a CBP officer
- Know how to contact UMBC in case of emergency
 - After hours: 410-455-5555 ask to speak to "ISSS"
- Check your I-94 record





COVID -19 Vaccination Requirements


- Proof of vaccination BEFORE traveling to the U.S. is now required
- Present vaccination information to airline and/or U.S. Customs and Border Protection, NOT ISSS or during visa interview



What To Pack

- Clothing: Baltimore has 4 distinct seasons
 - o It will be winter when you arrive. Prepare for the cold weather!
 - Winter clothing can be purchased at reasonable prices in the US.
- Personal items: books, music, something that reminds you of home
- Food: no live agricultural products! Dried spices are usually acceptable.
 - CBP General Food List
 - Many local stores carry foods from around the world
- Documents: in your carry-on luggage, NOT checked luggage!
- Cell phone: will you need a SIM card? Phone plan?




Arrival Weather

• It will be winter!

 Make sure you have clothes with you that will help you feel comfortable in temperatures averaging around 2°C

- In January in Maryland, most people would wear layers!
- Occasionally, Maryland also experiences winter storms. Make sure you have appropriate footwear/prepare to bundle up if it snows.





Getting From the Airport

- UMBC does not provide transportation from the airport
- You can arrive at ANY airport in U.S.
- The following airports are the closest to UMBC:
 - BWI (Baltimore Washington International Airport)

Distance to UMBC: 7 miles

Uber/Lyft/Taxi:

- Average trip cost: \$30-40 USD
- · Taxi pickup on lower arrivals level
- Uber/Lyft meeting point on upper departures level

Super Shuttle:

- · Average trip price: \$55 USD
- Must book in advance online <u>here</u>

DCA (Washington Ronald Reagan National Airport)


Distance to UMBC: 40 miles

Uber/Lyft/Taxi average trip cost: \$100 USD

IAD (Washington Dulles International Airport)

Distance to UMBC: 55 miles

Uber/Lyft/Taxi average trip cost: \$140 USD



Campus ID


- You'll need your campus ID for most things on campus
- Request process is electronic can do this from outside U.S.
 - submit photo here
 - receive a confirmation from Campus Card and Mail services
 - pick up campus card when you arrive on campus
- Campus ID is required to ride the UMBC shuttle
 - UMBC transit will accept a print out of your confirmation email until you have a physical campus ID card





How to Check In with ISSS

- All new international students must confirm arrival with ISSS via the ISSS Portal. Please check in through the ISSS Portal and not in person.
- Complete <u>"New Student Arrival Documentation Check-in"</u> in the ISSS Portal
 - Select your Term: "Spring, 2023"
 - Upload documents: Visa stamp page, <u>I-94 record</u>
 - Update your personal information on myUMBC: U.S. address,
 Foreign address, U.S. phone number, Foreign phone number,
 Emergency contact
- Check In can be completed only via the ISSS Portal not at the ISSS
 Office



Getting an On-Campus Job

- Can begin working as soon as you arrive in U.S.
- Positions must be on campus and paid by UMBC
- Apply through Handshake- make sure to visit the Career Center's <u>online</u> resources!
- If you're new to the U.S. you'll need a <u>SSN</u> after getting a job offer. ISSS will help you with that process



- How much can you work a week?
 - During semester: 20 hours
 - During summer/winter break: 40 hours
- Off Campus work is prohibited until you have completed two academic semesters

- Profile About View More
- Update the following:
 - Student Mailing Address, to your US address
 - Phone Numbers, once you set up a US number
 - Emergency Contacts this is who UMBC will communicate with should you have a serious emergency
- Use the "edit" link to make changes to each field.


It is EXTREMELY IMPORTANT to update this information, which we need to make your immigration record active once you arrive, and is required by immigration law!





Phone Access/SIM Cards

- Able to use WiFi for using WhatsApp and other free communication tools
- If you want a U.S. number upon arrival, SIM Cards are the way to go! CampusSims is a SIM card you can purchase before arrival
- ISSS has SIM cards available for students who might need them






Getting Around - Transportation Off Campus

Keep COVID-19 restrictions and protocols in mind when using public transportation

- Public Transportation: <u>Maryland Transportation Authority</u>
 - Bus: takes you throughout Baltimore, and surrounding cities
 - Metro: takes you throughout Baltimore
 - Light Rail: takes you throughout Baltimore
 - Fare: \$1.90 per trip, All Access College Transit Pass: \$52.90 per month
- Free Options:
 - Charm City Circulator (downtown Baltimore only)
 - UMBC shuttle
- Getting your License:
 - SEVIS record MUST be registered
 - Complete S.A.V.E Verification
 - Visit MVA's website
 - o On campus parking permits are free. Please apply here: Parking Permits
- Traveling further outside of Baltimore and Maryland? Check out the arrival guide for long distance options





Banking

- Banks near campus (call ahead to find out COVID restrictions or changes)




Living Costs - Plan Ahead

- Budgets/costs vary for each student
- <u>UMBC Tuition Calculator</u> (select "Out of State" for residency)
- Do you have a scholarship?
 - Make sure you understand what your scholarship does/does not cover
- Do you have a Graduate Assistantship?
 - Make sure you understand what is included in your assistantship
 - Understand your stipend and how that affects your costs
- Will you live alone? With family? Roommates?
