Have a Question for ISSS? Follow the steps below!



Always check the website first!

- Always do this first! Visit isss.umbc.edu
- Most answers are found on the website and there are icons that link you to common topics

Searched and can't find an answer? Go to step 2

Step

Ask us on live chat

- Ask an ISSS advisor quick questions
- Keep it brief, other students may be in the queue
- Don't use live chat to follow up on I-20 requests or help tickets

Question too complicated? Go to step 3

Step

Submit a Help Ticket

- Once you submit a ticket, all ISSS staff can see it (no need to CC staff)
- <u>Current response time: 5-7 business</u>
 <u>days</u>

Still require further assistance? Go to step 4



Advising Appointment

- An advisor can let you know if your situation requires an advising appointment
- Most questions are resolved before this step
- Don't need an appointment anymore?
 Cancel it!

Remember: don't use live chat, tickets, or appointments to follow up on the status of your I-20 or other requests


Important:







Fall 2023 Considerations



Things To Consider For Fall 2023

- The earliest you can arrive in the US is 30 days before your I-20 program start date
- Must enter US by August 30th
- Be informed of travel and vaccine requirements in your home countries as well as in the <u>U.S.</u>
- Full time enrollment required (UG: 12 credits, Graduate: 9 credits)
- UMBC is offering a combination of in person, hybrid and online courses
- As you are planning your course schedule, <u>please don't plan to enroll in more than one online class</u>.
 Formal guidance on online course limits to come

Transfer Students:

- Students currently in F-1 status in the U.S. transferring to UMBC from another institution
- Please follow regular I-20 transfer guidelines
- Planning to travel home? Already at home and planning to return for the semester?

Entering the US after Deferring to Fall 2023

What happens to your I-20?

- Program dates must be adjusted OR new completely new Form I-20 issued
- Updated financial documents required if originals are over 6 months old
- SEVIS fee is valid for one year

Graduate Assistants (RA, TA etc)

Work directly with department on updating your GA offer

Entry to the US

- Fall 2023 semester begins August 30th
- Only able to enter the U.S. at most 30 days before the start of Fall 2023
- "Earliest Admission Date" section on your I-20

- Select "Log in with myUMBC"

- You will be asked to select from available terms
- Fall = August Start Date
- Spring = January Start Date
- Term is listed on your admissions offer



Financial Requirements for I-20



UPLOAD
REQUIRED
DOCUMENTS:
FINANCIALS +
PASSPORT.


- Amount required is based on estimated cost of an Academic Year (9 months)
- Amount is specific to UMBC only
- For Fall 2023 Admission at UMBC that is:
 - Undergraduate: \$46,990
 - Graduate: \$41,788
- No cost to request a UMBC I-20
- What documents are accepted?



Sources of Funding for I-20



- Checking/savings account bank statements
- Approved loan documents
- Scholarship awards
- Graduate Assistantships
- Fixed deposits (only if you can withdraw the money at any time)
- Documents CANNOT be older than 6 months
- Letter of Support/Affidavit



- Stocks or bonds
- Real estate holdings
- Retirement Funds
- Salary information
- Life insurance policies
- Unapproved loan documents
- Documents older than 6 months
- Pay Slips/Salary Statement

RECEIVE
SIGNED
ELECTRONIC I20

- Make sure you click the button to submit your request. Status should be "submitted under review". Requests with a status of "pending" have not been submitted
- Processed within 5-7 business days
- Receive an electronic I-20 with an electronic signature from ISSS staff
- Alert ISSS staff of any necessary changes/updates
- Print your I-20 out and hand sign in blue ink before your interview

- Once you have received your I-20 you can continue the F-1 Visa interview application process
- Pay <u>I-901 SEVIS Fee</u>
- Complete DS-160
- Schedule Interview

Funding Your Studies

Undergraduate

- Merit scholarships available based on GPA, test scores, application materials
- Contacted directly by Office of Financial Aid and Scholarships after admission
- scholarships.umbc.edu

Graduate

- Funding in the form of Graduate Assistantships (RA,TA)
- Not guaranteed and very competitive
- Funding is up to your specific department
- Contact information for your department: <u>UMBC Graduate Programs</u>




Employment is limited under F-1 status

The employment rules are very strict and must be followed carefully

Types of Employment

- On-Campus Employment
- Off Campus Employment (Practical Training)
 - Curricular Practical Training (CPT)
 - Optional Practical Training (OPT)
- Need-based employment (off-campus)
 - Severe, Unexpected, Documented Economic Hardship (USCIS processing fee of \$410)





On-Campus Employment

- Can begin working on arrival
- Jobs on UMBC campus only
- Apply through Handshake
- Will need an SSN after getting a job offer. ISSS will help you with process
- How much can you work a week?
 - During semester: 20 hours
 - During summer/winter break: 40 hours
- Finding a position is competitive and not guaranteed



Off-Campus Employment: CPT

CPT: Curricular Practical Training

- Paid internships while a current student
- Eligible after 2 academic semesters in US
- Must be authorized by ISSS, noted on I-20
- Must be related to your degree program
- How much can you work a week?
 - During Semester: Part Time 20 hours
 - During Summer/Winter Breaks: Full Time 20+ hours



OPT and STEM OPT Extension

OPT

- 1 year full time work permission after graduation
- Work can be: part time, full time, paid or unpaid
- Job must be related to degree

STEM OPT

- 2 year **extension** of work authorization
- Who is eligible for STEM Extension? Any student with a STEM eligible major
- Check if your major is STEM eligible <u>here</u>. To find your major, use the CIP Code on your I-20 to search the list
- Advisors guide students through the process of applying for OPT and STEM OPT



Off-Campus Employment: Economic Hardship

- For students in unexpected financial hardship
- Have to prove source of unexpected difficulties
- Not often approved, have to make a very strong case
- Application to USCIS costs \$410
- Don't rely on this option!






Students are responsible for securing their own accommodation



- Offer academic advising or pick your classes for you







Plan Ahead

- Budgets/costs vary for each student
- <u>UMBC Tuition Calculator</u> (select "Out of State" for residency)
- Do you have a scholarship?
 - Make sure you understand what your scholarship does/does not cover
- Do you have a Graduate Assistantship?
 - Make sure you understand what is included in your assistantship
 - Understand your stipend and how that affects your costs
- Will you live alone? With family? Roommates?




Example Costs in Maryland








