





PROGRAM DETAILS

- Average 20 hours/week.
- 5 start dates options: Spring (2), Fall (2) and Summer (1).
- All levels aligned with CEFR standards.
- Skills: speaking, listening, reading, writing, grammar, vocabulary, and pronunciation.
- Tuition: Fall and Spring: \$4,600/semester, Summer: \$3,450.

ACADEMIC ENGLISH PROGRAM (AEP)

Prepares those with high-intermediate or advanced English to pursue a U.S. degree.

INTENSIVE ENGLISH PROGRAM (IEP)

Designed for those wishing to improve their English skills for personal, professional, or academic reasons.

Customized Special Programs

Special Programs offer professional development, English language training, and cultural immersion activities. Programs can be fully customized to meet participants' goals and interests.

PROGRAM FEATURES:



LEADERSHIP SKILLS

- Build leadership skills through training seminars designed to meet the needs and goals of participants and cohorts.
- Participants will learn how to identify, research, present, and address issues in the world and their communities.



ENGLISH LANGUAGE TRAINING

- Authentic practice with native English speakers.
- Participants of all proficiency levels and backgrounds welcome.
- Skilled and experienced faculty provide participants with individualized attention.



PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT

- Daily programming focused on site visits, networking, visiting speakers, goal setting and building partnerships.
- Past activities include networking with leaders in STEM, Medicine, Cybersecurity, Education, Law, Social Justice, Government, and Civic Engagement.



CULTURAL ENGAGEMENT

- Experience U.S. culture in the Maryland and Washington D.C. region.
- Activities can include, national tourist sites, sporting events, museums, university tours, and more.
- Connect with local students, professionals, and leaders.



PROGRAM DETAILS

Duration: Programs typically range between 2 - 6 weeks.

Accommodation: Double occupancy dorms or four bedroom apartment options available.

Meals: On-campus meal plans including Halal, Kosher, vegan, and vegetarian.

Transit: Access to UMBC's free student shuttle and local transit. Campus vehicles (buses and vans) available for charter.

On-Campus Entertainment: Participants have use of on-campus student facilities and campus activities.

Health Insurance: UMBC organized coverage plans available.

Undergraduate Scholarships and Postgraduate Assistantships

UNDERGRADUATE SCHOLARSHIPS

- Open to first-year undergraduates starting in the Fall semester.
- Students are automatically considered at time of application.
- Must have a 3.0 equivalent GPA or higher at time of application.
- Valued at up to \$12,000/year, renewable for up to 4 years (must maintain a 3.25 GPA).


POSTGRADUATE ASSISTANTSHIPS

- Opportunity to work closely with faculty, staff, and students in teaching, research, or administrative environments.
- Gain professional expertise, enhance research skills, acquire academic and administrative experience.
- May have eligibility requirements and/or not available for all programs.

Deadlines and **Application Information**

UNDERGRADUATE REQUIREMENTS

- Competitive undergraduate applicants have the equivalent of a "B" average.
- Required Documents: Completed application submitted via the CommonApp, essay, \$75 application fee, transcript(s), evidence of English proficiency.
- Optional Documents: Letters of recommendation, standardized test scores, any requirements for Scholars Programs or Visual and Performing Arts Majors.

FIRST-YEAR STUDENTS

- Fall Priority Deadline: November 1
- Fall Final Deadline: February 1
- Spring Priority Deadline: October 15
- Spring Final Deadline: December 1

TRANSFER STUDENTS

- Fall Priority Deadline: March 1
- Fall Final Deadline: June 1
- Spring Priority Deadline: October 15 Spring Final Deadline: December 1
- Transfer Applicant Additional Documents: official course-by-course evaluation

- Optional Documents: Resume, GRE (if requested), additional program specified documents.
